#### Water, water everywhere

It was disappointing to see local Conservative MP Alan Mak vote for 15 more years of sewage releases in the draft *Environmental Targets Regulations* on January 25th 2023. To be clear: these regulations will do <u>nothing</u> to limit the recent record-breaking pollution of the sea around Hayling, which is at odds with Labour's anti-pollution targets. **In November and December last year the E.coli levels of bacteria in the sea around Hayling were 760 times the legal limit<sup>1</sup>. I would strongly urge everyone to follow <u>Hayling Sewage Watch</u> on Facebook where all of the most dangerous sewage releases are documented. You will also see details regarding forthcoming protests - join in and make your voice heard!** 

#### But not a drop I'd drink

In August 2022 HBC gave Southern Water permission to build a new reservoir in Havant Thicket where recycled wastewater will be mixed with naturally sourced water. This would be the first

such use of recycled wastewater in the U.K. Conservative leader of HBC, Councillor Alex Rennie, has said that these plans were 'not clear' in the original documentation and yet has only asked for them to be 'correctly scrutinised' instead of rejecting them out-of-hand<sup>2</sup>. Whilst recycled water is in operation in California where it is a solution to seasonal droughts, it is not considered fit for human consumption and should only be used for non-potable purposes such as watering gardens and flushing toilets. It is for this reason that Havant Labour fully opposes Southern Water's national experiment on local residents. This is not a time for weak leadership: we demand that Havant's houses are supplied with water that is 100% safe. HBC should reject all plans to mix recycled water with natural water supplied to private residences.

#### **Housing and Targets**

It seems strange that a little more than a year ago Councillor Alex Rennie wrote about HBC's "obligation to meet housing targets" in his letter to Michael Gove and Christopher Pincher<sup>3</sup> but has not updated the local plan following PM Rishi Sunak's decision in early December of last year to abandon these housing targets<sup>4</sup>. **Labour will challenge the need for a local plan that puts thousands of houses on Hayling**: Hayling has been starved of maintenance, let alone an evolving infrastructure, and residents certainly don't want greenfield sites and protected wildlife annihilated in the name of targets that no longer exist. Labour Councillor Phil Munday is presently putting this argument to the majority Conservative Council; it will be interesting to see if they continue with their revised Local Plan in this new light - watch this space.

#### Another 'Levelling Up' Funding Failure

For all Mr. Mak's party sycophancy and the similar behaviour of many other Conservative members at HBC, their latest **Levelling Up** bid was as unsuccessful as the last, resulting in nil funding for Havant in 2023. However, in fairness to those involved, it does appear that a considerable effort was made on the bid itself and no doubt the local Conservatives are extremely disheartened to find that they have failed once again.

Given that the Conservatives' marginal constituencies in the Red Wall were so much more successful in receiving LU funding, it would be perfectly reasonable to presume that Havant is being consistently rejected because we're such a 'safe' Conservative seat at present. On that basis it also makes sense to conclude that, were Havant to become a Labour constituency at the next election, Keir Starmer would divert significant funds here in order to preserve its status as such... worth a thought, voters.

#### May the Fourth Be With You (but remember your I.D.!)

It was encouraging to see the voting pattern change so dramatically last year, despite the contention that many Hayling residents would 'vote for a poodle wearing a blue rosette!' Clearly, this is not necessarily the case and based on current trends we could well see the very first


